Overall Learning outcomes over five sessions:

- Knowledge of returning employees to work programmes
- Rehabilitation case management for employer and employee
- Clinical ergonomics analysis
- Pertinent knowledge in development of job analysis, productivity measurement (MODAPTS), Work ability screening, using functional capacity evaluation information, condition management at work and anxiety management at work.
- Advising on and assessing DDA compliancy and sick absence resolution
- DWP work capacity assessment
- Development of work hardening programmes
- Enabling work environments and assistive technology in the workplace
- Broadened knowledge, theory, science of vocational rehabilitation
- Enhanced competency for practice in vocational rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation Foundations: Getting up to Speed - 8 February 2008

Update on current UK initiatives, philosophies, models in vocational rehabilitation and case management. This day will focus on the field of vocational rehabilitation in the UK today providing the fundamental theoretical building blocks needed to be able to practice reflectively, and create bespoke interventions in different settings and client groups.

Vocational Rehabilitation Assessment: 'Tools of Trade' - 10 & 11 March 2008

The purpose of these two days will be to train practitioners in the use of internationally researched assessment tools and techniques needed to assess people for work. Case study examples will be used and participants will be able get a brief overview of each test-tool you should have in your assessment package. Information regarding the suppliers of the test will be provided for participants to order their own equipment.

Vocational Rehabilitation Intervention strategies and return to employment programmers that work: the real challenge - 14 & 15 April 2008, advanced case management

These days will focus on how to design intervention strategies, goal setting and monitoring of return to work plans. Liaison with employers, solicitors, insurers and clients will be emphasized; drawing up client responsibilities, rights and expectations of case managers will be covered; case examples will be used throughout and participants will be expected to complete one planned intervention and return it to the Course Leader following the course.

Vocational Rehabilitation on Case Management: placement in work and maintaining at work, preventing the rotating door scenario - 27 & 28 May 2008, advanced case management

The purpose of these study days is to equip the participants with skills, knowledge and expertise in "placing people at work" and maintaining them there. Excellence in case management services and practitioners will be emphasized.

Advanced Vocational Rehabilitation Practice: research and reflective practice, new initiatives - 14 & 15 July 2008

This session will focus on training of advanced vocational rehabilitation skills, group assessment, factory productivity and ergonomic assessments.
